Grammar: Introduce Present-Tense Verbs:

- A verb's **tense** refers to time.
- A verb in the **present tense** tells about an action that happens now or happens over and over.

Happens now: Tucker lives in the subway.

Happens over and over: Many trains <u>pull</u> into the station every day.

TUESDAY- During Zoom Class Instruction:

Focus Skill: Discuss Text Structure: Sequence:

Students will read pages 624-625 and then the teacher will model identifying the structural pattern in the text.

Introduction of Robust Vocabulary Words: The teacher will go through the list of words, its explanations, and pronunciations.

- 1. **remarkable-** A remarkable thing is something very special in a way that makes other people notice it.

Reinforce the Focus Skill: Text Structure: Sequence:

Authors of expository nonfiction sometimes organize events in the order in which they occur.

- Authors of scientific texts may use **sequence** to describe growth and change in nature.
- Authors of social studies texts may use **sequence** to describe historical events.
- **Time-order words,** including *days, weeks, months,* and *years,* often signal a sequence of events.

Students will them complete **Practice Book page 140**.

Comprehension Strategy: Review Asking Questions:

Students can monitor their understanding of a selection they are reading by pausing to ask themselves questions. Students can ask questions about:

- Unfamiliar words or terms.
- Connections within and beyond the text.
- Steps in a process or the sequence of events.

Building Background for "Mangrove Wilderness": What do you know about the functions of different parts of trees and about the role trees play in the environment?

	TREES
Parts	Roots: take in water and nutrients Trunk: provides support; carries the nutrients to all parts of the plant Leaves: absorb sunlight, make food
Role in the environment	Provide homes for animals Produce oxygen Provide food for some animals

Develop Concepts: Trees:

- Roots sprout from seeds that have fallen from trees. The roots of a tree take in nutrients and water, and they help hold the tree upright.
- Leaves collect sunlight and use it to make food for the plant. Leaves also provide food for insects and other creatures. When leaves fall, they break down and provide nutrients that become part of the soil or water.
- Trees provide homes for animals and are important parts of the environment.

Discuss Expository Nonfiction: Students will read the genre information on page 628.

Genre Features:

- The genre is **expository nonfiction**.
- The text contains **facts** and **information**.
- Headings, photos, and captions provide additional information.

Students will **ask questions** while they read. Then look for the answers in the text.

Review Vocabulary Words

Spelling words: The meaning of each spelling word will be discussed.

Respond to the Literature: Have students respond orally to questions 1-5 on page 642. Discuss with students their responses.

Grammar: Introduce Past- and Future- Tense Verbs:

- A **past tense verb** tells about an action that happened in the past.
- Add -ed to regular verbs to form the past tense. Most verbs are regular.

Spelling Rule	Example	
Add - <i>ed</i> to the end of most regular verbs.	learn	learn ed
If a verb ends with <i>e</i> , drop the <i>e</i> before adding <i>-ed</i> .	erase	eras ed
If a verb ends with a consonant and a <i>y</i> , change <i>y</i> to <i>i</i> before adding <i>-ed</i> .	study	stud ied
If a verb ends with a vowel and a consonant, double the final consonant before adding <i>-ed</i> .	hop	hop ped
