MONDAY- During Zoom Class Instruction:

Focus Skill: Review Main Idea and Details:

Students will read pages 700-701 and then the teacher will model identifying the main idea.

Introduction of Robust Vocabulary Words: The teacher will go through the list of words, its explanations, and pronunciations.

- **1. ancient-** Something ancient is very, very old.
- **2. distant** Something distant is very far away.
- **3. sentries-** Sentries are people who stand as guards around a camp, building, or other area.
- 4. glistens- Something that glistens looks wet and shiny.
- **5. embedded-** If an object is embedded in something, it is tuck firmly in it.

- **6. cascading-** Cascading water rushes or falls downward very fast.
- **7. weary-** If you are weary, you are very tired from working hard at something, and you want to stop.
- **8. eroding-** Something that is eroding is being slowly scraped away a little at a time, often by the force of moving water or strong wind.

Build Robust Vocabulary: Students will read *The Amazing Power of Rivers* on pages 702-703, then the teacher will read the pages aloud and ask questions about the highlighted words. Students will then complete **Practice Book page 157.**

Reinforce the Focus Skill: Main Idea and Details:

• The **main idea** of a passage or selection is its most important idea.

- The main idea is supported by **details.**
- Sometimes the main idea is not stated directly.
- Details in a passage may provide clues to help you figure out an unstated main idea.

Students will then complete Practice Book page 159.

Comprehension Strategy: Summarize: You should **summarize** sections of text while you read. Pausing to summarize as you read can help you understand the main ideas in a text.

- Pause after reading each section of text.
- Include only the **most important events or ideas** in a summary.
- Use your **own words** to retell ideas and events.

Building Background for "Grand Canyon: A Trail Through Time": The next selection you will read is about the Grand Canyon, which is in the southwestern part of the United States. What do you know about the Grand Canyon?

Develop Concepts: Grand Canyon:

- The Grand Canyon is a very deep canyon that was carved out of rock long ago by the Colorado River, which still runs along the bottom.
- The Grand Canyon cuts through Arizona in the southwestern United States.
- The Grand Canyon is in a desert area, and a variety of desert plants and animal live in and near the Canyon.

Discuss Narrative Nonfiction: Students will read the genre information on page 704. Students will be asked to page through the selection and identify examples of factual information as well as words that tell about time.

Genre Features:

- The genre is narrative nonfiction.
- The text tells about **real people**, **places**, or **things**.
- Events are organized in time order.

Students should pause while they read to **summarize** sections of text.

Review Spelling Words: The meaning of each spelling word will be discussed.
